Crop growth stage

Crops across the country are at variable growth stage depending on the amount of rain they have received. Growers should have apply the last of the nitrogen applications to linseed during green bud stage (see in picture below).

NITROGEN PLANNING

Most crop have now received their first split of Nitrogen. Subtract this figure from the total of 120kg/ha to calculate the remaining Nitrogen to be applied. **This should be applied at Green Bud Stage or very early flowering. DO NOT APPLY IN MID STEM EXTENSION.** Linseed will not translocate Nitrogen from the stem or leaves to the seed capsules, so applying the final dose too early will in drive stem extension, increase lodging risk and not benefit yield.

Later flowering fungicide

While the weather recently has been dry, a fungicide to keep bolls green and free of any Botrytis and Pasmo

infections. Fungicides should be applied when there are more bolls than flowers seen in the crop.

A suitable product would be:

| Product | Rate | Notes |
|---------|----------|-------------------------|
| Folicur | 0.75l/ha | At the end of flowering |

Ensure annual maximum rates of tebuconazole are not exceeded
